Andrea Petö (PhD, Eötvös University) is an Associate Professor at the Department of Gender Studies at the Central European University, Hungary. She is the President of the gender and women's history section of the Hungarian Historical Association, the Feminist Section of the Hungarian Sociological Association and co-President of AtGender, The European Association for Gender Research, Education and Documentation.

Her main research interests include European comparative social and gender history; gender and politics; women's movements; qualitative methods; oral history; and Holocaust. Presently she is working on gendered memory of World War II and political extremism. Andrea Petö is the author of several books and articles on European comparative social and gender history.
